WILL URGE DIX TO SIGN 54-HOUR BILL

Reform Organizations to Call on Governor and Plead for Labor Measure.

Representatives of various reform organizations which were instrumental in having the fifty-four-hour bill for women and children passed by the Assembly and Senate, and which is now awaiting Governor Dix's signature before it becomes a law, held a conference at the City Club yesterday and decided to make representations to the Governor and urge him to sign the bill.

NEW ORLEANS, La., April 10.—The offering of a reward of \$500 for the man who today is supposed to have cut the levee on the west bank of the Atchafalaya River has brought home to the citizens of Louisiana the most alarming feature that so far has developed in the flood situation in this State.

The levee today was the second important break in Louisiana, and it, as well as its predecessor, which was in the levee on the other side of the Atchafalaya, are supposed to have been with design.

Plans now under way look to arming all the levee guards in the State, including those who now are patrolling the big dikes that surround New Orleans.
